Leadership & Adventure Camp



THE LEADERSHIP & ADVENTURE CAMP IS AN ACTION-PACKED, ONE-WEEK RESIDENTIAL SUMMER CAMP FOR BOYS ENTERING 5TH CLASS TO THOSE FINISHING 2ND YEAR. DRAWING UPON DECADES OF EXPERIENCE, THE CAMP AIMS TO HELP THE PARTICIPANTS DEVELOP THE CHARACTER SKILLS AND GOOD HABITS NECESSARY TO BECOME LEADERS.



Each boy becomes a member of a team, which works together on activities, competes for prizes and shares living accommodation.

Each day, participants have a talk about character development, followed by a wide range of fun, sporting and challenging activities, such as soccer, tag-rugby, canoeing, archery and raft-building. Evenings offer night-games (such as Fox Hunt, a Treasure Hunt and Capture the Flag) and a Talent Show. Spiritual activities, such as Mass, the Rosary, catechism class and confession, are also offered.

Throughout the week, the staff help the boys apply principles of leadership and lessons from the character development talks to specific challenges during the camp. Most importantly, the staff speak individually with each participant to help him grow in self-knowledge and to formulate resolutions for growing in character during and after the camp.

Father & Son Weekend

During the final two days of the camp, Dads join the boys for a vast array of father and son challenges, fun competitions, night-games and the awards ceremony on the last day.

The Staff

The staff members of the Leadership Camp have been carefully selected and trained to be outstanding role models. They share the ideals of the camp and are dedicated to the personal growth of each boy. Many of them are former participants themselves. The head staff are adult men who have experience running camps and other character-building activities for young people. The leaders for each team consist of college and secondary school students who are chosen for their maturity and experience.
